## EAST A TVTAL WREOK．

The Strong House Ruined by Fire This Morning

A little before $30^{\prime}$＇olock thismorm－ ing，fire was discovered in the room mmediately over the bar room of he Strong House． Thie alarm was soon convered the water works when the fire whis－ tle gave its unearthly shrieks，awak－ ening our citizens from their peace ful slumbers，and to the fact that re was somewhere in town
The fire department promptly re－ ponded，and，with a number of other citizens，were soon on the scene．
At first two streams of water were thought to be sufficient \％o ex－ tinguish the flames；but it soon be－ came evident that more were neces－ sary，and accordingly the other hose cart was run out and two mor streams ware playing on the ete ments．When these had been work－ ing for a short time it was thought the fire was under control，but i broke out afresh，flames and smoke issuing from the roof in great vol－ mes，and one of the hose carts wa dispatched for more hoose．Thes were attached to a hydrant，and i a few morments the five streams were
found to be insufficient to quench the fire．A second time the hose cart returned to the hall for hose， when，after due time，six fine streams of water were battling with the now surging mass of flames

## After a long fight of over three

 hours，during which time it wa confined to the hotel alone，the fire was entirely extinguished．The building was owned by A G．VanWey，and was occupied by John Cowan．
The damage to building and fur niture is estinated at from $\$ 3,000$ to $\$ 5,000$ ．We have been unable to ascertain the amount of insur arice．but understand it was quite well insured．Most of the farniture in the front part of the house was saved．
About the first to discover th fire were Wm．Lafave and Mike Lil ly，who were sleeping in the second story．They were awakened by the smoke，and springing out of bed， saw their only chance of escape lay in jumping from the window，whic they did，the only injury sustained being a lame foot for eac
