Mr. Widdifield then assumed entire control of the business of the hotel and continued to run it till in De. cember, 1889 when it was destroyed by fire.
Recovering from this financial blow, they: started the Aldine, which enjoys the credit of being one the neatest and cleanest little hotels in northern Mighigan.:
Three children were alsorborn of these, the eldest of which died in infancy, Cecil, five years old, and an infant son, night still living. She seemed quite smart up to two tacked by fits, and going out of one into another was soon utterly ex hausted.
