## THE FOURTH A GRAND SUCCESS.

The Celebration at Tawas City a Brilliant One.

The Exhibition from First to Last a Pleasant. Event.

Last Monday witnessed one of the grandest turn-outs in the history of the Tawases. Both towns united in the celebration, and the day being the finest our county had been blessed with for some time, multitudes of people from our neighboring townships and villages were spectators on the scene, as well as visitors from abroad.

The salute of the cannon at midnight, which was in charge of Sheriff Bradley, aroused enthusiasm in our people, as did also the report of 100 guns in the wee hours of the morning.

At 9 o'clock the several societies of Tawas City, East Tawas and Alabaster formed with the Grand Parade in front of C. H. Prescott & Sons' stores. John W. King, Mar--The people on the old Plank shal of the Day, had charge of the Road are about to have the same parade, which was headed by the Tawas City Cornet Band, and conducted it through the principal avenues of the village. Returning to Lake St., they marched into the court house yard, which was elaborately decorated for the occasion

The thirteen young ladies, representing the original states, conveyed by the four-horse team in the parade was a grand feature of the program. Miss Nettie Darling was a beautiful representation of the "Goddess of Liberty."

The literary program of the day was opened by prayer by Rev. Univer, which was followed by a patriotic selection by the band. James Hamilton, Pres't of the Day, then introduced Rev. Moody, who made a few appropriate remarks, and was followed by an excellent address by County Clerk C. A. Jahraus, which was heartily applauded by several thousand people. Next on the program was L. I. Halsey, who was to have read the Declaration of Independence, but owing to other prominent features which he had to take part in, this duty devolved upon J. M. Waterbury, who read very creditably. Dinner was next in order.

Never before was such interest taken as in the Calithumpians. The mill men and citizens donated all their horses and vehicles to those interested in this "line of march." The Tawas City brigade formed at Prescott's barn, and was engineered by Capt. A. W. Lowe. They first went to the fair grounds between the towns, at which place they halted and dispatched a lightning messenger to brigade No. 2, at East Tawas which was in waiting at Bearinger's barn. They promptly responded, and headed by their Capt. and Marshal of the Day, Chas. Curry, in company with our brigade paraded East Tawas, and returning up Lake St. through the principle streets of Tawas City.
