The following extracts from the cons titation of the United States and the lear light how thoroughly the country guarded against a union of churc liberty is guaranteed to all citizens These fundamental principles cannot be departed from with safety and those assailing them should reeeive no counConance from loyal citizens: Constitution of the United States: ng an establishment of religion, or pros hibiting the free exercise thereof
uired as a qualification to any office or public trust under the United States." Constitution of Michigan:
Art. iv., Sec. 39,-The legislature rom worshiping Almaighty God according to the dictates of his own conscience, or to compel any person to attend, erect or sapport any place of religious wor
ship, or to pay tithes,. taxes or other ates for the support of any miuister of the gospel or teacher of religion. Sec. 40 No money shall be appro
priated or drawn from the priated or drawn from the treasury for she benefit of any religious sect or society, theological or religious semi nary, nor shall property belonging to the state be appropriated for any such diminish or enlarge the civil or political rights, privileges and capacities of any person on account of his opinion or belie! concerning matters of religion. These requirements of the nationa constitution every public officer takes end, and cannot depart from them without perjury and treason. These are the constitutional provisions which C
