4th. Certificates of promotion for pupils on finishing the work of each grade of their course.

5th. Common school diplomas for pupils who complete the entire course.

This latter part will create some expense, and it cannot be put in successful operation without a (small) appropriation for the purpose which your honorable body is herewith respectfully requested to make. It is confidently expected that when once the system is established it will be heartily supported by all who know its benefits. I have arranged for a free course of lectures on educational topics to be given in various parts of the county commencing Jan. 21, 1893.

I have found one district that has adopted free text books, the working of which will be reported as soon as it has been fairly tried.

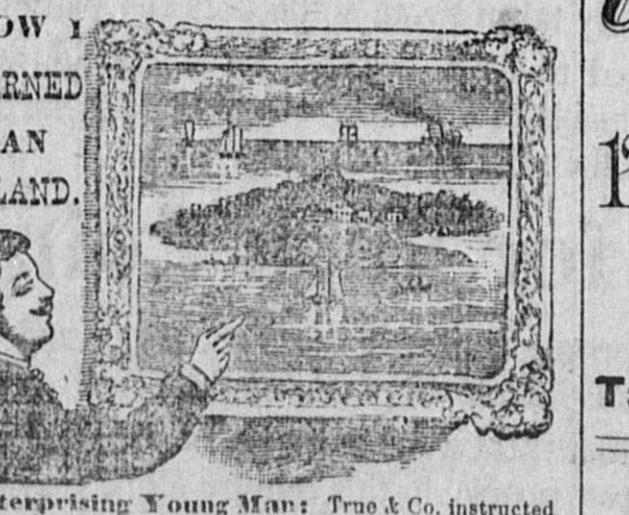

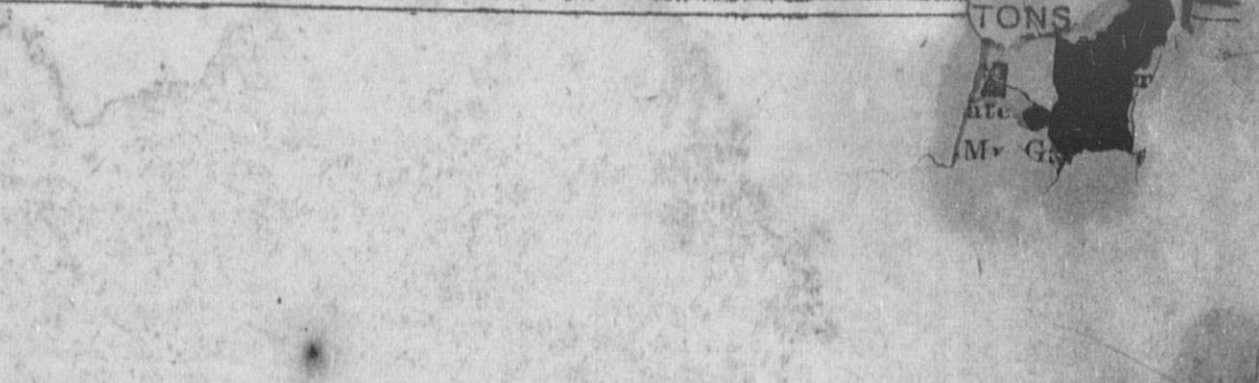
