Steamers, Albany and Phila delphla meet in a Heavy Fog Tuesday Morning.
About 2 o'clock Tuesday morn ing the two large propellers Alban of the Western Trancit Co. and the Philadelphia, of the Archor line collided in a heavy fog, of Poin Aux Barques. Both captains re frain from making any statement as to their movements immediately preceeding the crash on account of the standing rules of their com panies. The Albany was cut into about five feet by the iron prow o the Philadelphia, and Captain An gus McDonald requested Captai A. E. Huff to take the Albany i tow with the hope of getting her is

This was soon seen to be a hope less undertaking, and the Albany' crew were transferred to the An chor liner. Half an hour latter it was seen that the Philadelphia, too was doomed, and the two crews were divided between the two ifeboats, Captain McDonald and Captain Huff with most of the of ficers going in one, and 24 seame going in the other.
The first lifeboat reached th shore in safty at 8 o'clock. Th Point aux Barques lifesaving crew was sent out in search of the other. It was found bottom side up, and near by were 11 bodies with life preservers on. It is supposed that the remaining 13 had no life pre ervers and immediately sank. Th placed on the steame City of Concord and brought to
East Tawas, where they were prepared for burial for Undertaker E L. King Six of them have been sent to their friends, and the othe five are being held for further in structions. It is probable that mos of them will be buried here. Capt A. E. Huff, of the Philadelphia and First Mate George F. Drury of the Albany, arrived Wednesday and identified the bodies. With one exception they were all members of the crew of the Philadel phia:
