## ARMY OF INVASION.

### It May Move to Cuba this Week.

New York, May 25 .-- A Washington special to the Journal says that the American army of invasion will have started for Cuba before the end of this week unless all signs fail, and it would not be surprising, after the embargo on the correspondents at l'ampa and other embarkation points is removed later in the week, to learn that they had sailed Thursday. Fifteen thousand men have been sleeping on their arms for weeks and can leave on a moment's notice. The expedition will start at night and a landing will be made early the following morning.
