Some weeks ago the supreme cour held that the Merriman law repealed the act of 1891 exempting from taxation for a period of 10 years, railroads constructed north of parellel 44 of latitude. The court held however, that the repeal did not become operative until Aug. 31, 1897, the date when the law took effect. Acting on this ruling, Railroad Commissioner Wesselius has assessed the taxes against the hitherto exempted roads for the months of September, October, November and December, 1897 as follows: Boyne City & Southeastern, \$256.49; Chicago & Northern Michigan, \$358.68; Emery Junction & Alpena division of the Detroit & Mackipac \$916.67; Manistee & Northeastern, \$182.50; Manistique & North western. \$726.32; Musining, \$542.12; Lewiston & Southeastern, \$561; Wisconsin & Michigan, \$398.06. The court's ruling, therefore, increased the revenue of the state from railroad taxes for 1897, a total of \$4,941.87.

CAN HE SERVE?

Question Raised as to Senator Smith's Eligibility

Although it has been talked for some time no hint has previously appeared in print that there was any question of the eligibility of Senatorelect Smith to sit as state senator from this, the twenty-eighth district. But it is even so. And it comes from this circumstance.

The law provides that no person holding an office under the state or the United States, shall be eligible to election as a member of the state legislature. And it has been held that a county office is an office under the state, within the meaning of the law. The law further provides that any votes cast for such person are void.

With no references at hand covering it, the writer recalls only one similiar case or cases. In 1891, two state senators were unseated. was postmaster at the time of his election, and the other, if we mistake not, was county clerk. The ground in each case was the law alluded to

Mr. Smith was still prosecuting atturney at the time of his election, and as such, it is claimed, was ineligible and that his opponent, I. S. Minthorn, is entitled to the seat.

However, the senate itself the is final judge of the qualification of its own members, and such bodies usually go more by favor than by law or justice either. As that body is heavily republican, ordinarly it would seem that there was ltttle danger of Smith's being unseated. But the rival Pingree and Burrows forces remain to be reckoned with. Either would prefer a democrat senator to one of the other faction, and it appears they now have a ciub to compel Smith to declare himself as to whose side he is on. Possibly the situation may help him to make up his mind.

As showing how such contests are usually settled, a story is told of Thad Preston, then representative in congress from a Pennsylvania district. and at the time chairmrn of a com. mittee to whom had been referred a contest for a seat. Considerable testimony had been taken, mostly in Preston's absence. A colleague on the committee approached him one day with a request that he formulate a report on the case, adding, "Whom shall we report in favor of?" "Well" said Thad, "Which is our rascal?"

And so it is in this case. If Smith declaret for a candidate for U.S. senator who has a clear majority of the state senate, he will probably hold his job. If he dosen't, he will just as probably be unseated-providing al ways that Minthorn contests .- Lule City Plain Dealer.


