William J. Bryan has resigned his commission as colonel of the third Nebraska Volunteer Infantry.

THE total vote for governor at the recent election was 421,144, as against 527,802 in 1896, a loss of 106,658. Piggree's plurality was 75,097.

HON. L. M. WESTON, for many years one of the leading democratic politicians of the state, died of Bright's disease, in New York, last Saturday.

GENERAL Garcia, the distinguished Cuban warrior and leader, and chairman of the commission elected by the Cuban assembly to visit this country died at Washington early Sunday morning.

It will be interesting to watch the proceedings of congress and see what class of people are the first to ask to be relieved from the war tax. It will be safe to offer odds that it will be bankers, brokers and brewers, and that the tax on them will be removed before that on the common people.

JOHN D. ROCKEFELLER'S income amounts to \$38.40 every minute, \$2,316.48 every hour, \$55,555.55 every day, or \$20,000,000 a year. He is now worth \$319,309,000, and expects to pile up \$1,000,000,000 before he dies. Luckily for the rest of us, he cannot take it with him.

THE Detroit barbers are taking steps to secure a law requiring tonorial artists to pass a sort of civil service examination before they can practice their profession. The proposed legislation is aimed particularly at the scores of cheap "barbers" turned out by the so-called "barber colleges" in Detroit.

THE Free Press of recent date says, "If all the vessels now ashore prove to be total losses this year will surpass all others in cost to underwriters. The year 1895 was the banner one in this respect, but already this season surpasses it. The bulk of this season's disasters came in the last four weeks. In that time nearly \$1,000,000, worth

of damage has been done the lake fleet. The total losses of 1897 of \$15,000 and upwards amounted to not more than \$207,000.

THE matter of changing the form of the present ballot used in Michigan to that of the regular Australian system is being agitated by some of the state press. Such a change we believe would be beneficial. The principal difference in the ballots is that the regular Australian system does away with the party tickets, and the names of the candidates for each office are arranged alphabetically under the name of the office. The voting is done by placing an x in front of the persons name for whom you wish to vote. We believe this would give the best satisfaction to the voters of any plan that can be adopted.

Circuit Court.

When we went to press last Friday, the case of Percy Jones, charged with the larceny of fish nets was on trial in the circuit court. It was given to the jury Friday afternoon, at three o'clock, and they could not agree on a verdict until about 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon, when a verdict of guilty was rendered.

The case against Fred Howie, charged with rape, was taken up Monday and given to the jury Tuesday, and a verdict of not guilty rendered.

In the liquor cases against A. G. VanWey and Samuel Anker, the defendants, each entered a plea of guilty as charged.

William Jolly was tried Wednesday on the charge of selling liquor to minors and the jury returned a verdict of guilty.

Thursday the case against Alex Wickland charged with violating the liquor law, was tried and given to the jury at noon. They remained in the jury room until 7 o'clock, and were then discharged without an agreement.

Court adjourned until Thursday of next week.

BEETS FOR BAY CITY.

Many Loads Were Received From Outside Counties.

Bay City, Dec. 11.—The stock of beets raised for the American Sugar Company was the largest ever produced for the first year of a new factory in the United States, exceeding the expectations of the projectors. In addition to the beets of Bay county there have been many brought from Huron, Tuscola, Saginaw, Genesee, Shiawassee, Midland, Gladwin, Arenac, Manistee and Iosco. One railroad has already delivered 160 car loads from outside counties. Next season a large territory will contribute to the Bay City factories. The railroads have already granted a rate of \$3 per car on beets brought within a radius of fifty miles of Bay City, and next year it is expected the distance will be increased to seventy-five miles, thereby making it as cheap for farmers living that far from town as for those in Bay county who now ship by rail. Auburn farmers, ten miles from Bay City, find that it is cheaper now for them to send beets by car than to haul them with wagons to the factory.

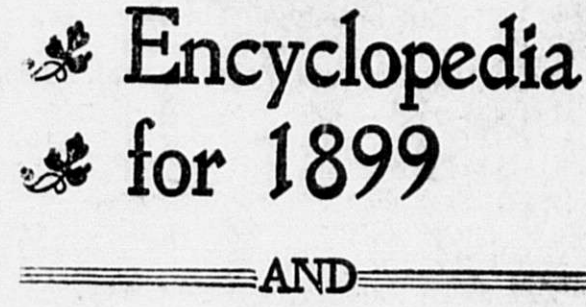
