Michigan Crop Report The following crop report was issued by the the secretary of state Snturilay.

The weather during the last month has been pleasant for November The average temperature for the month was about four degrees warm er than usual, while the precipitation in nue inch below the normal in lowe peuinsula; in the upper peninsula it has been very dry, the precipitution many places being less than ou unch, or about two iuches below the normal. These conditions were fuvor able for the harvesting of corn and sugar beets but detrimental to wheat. Coojer weather, with more moisture would, uo doubt, have been beneficial to wheat, enabling it to make better growth. The crop would have doue well under the existiug conditions had it not been for the Hessian fly The condition of wheat, as compared with au average, is 80 in the state. A large majority of the corres-
pondents report wheat as being badiy damaged by the fly; a ferv renor the condition good. Late sow Wheat, in many instances, is as hadly infested as that sown early, which is robably due to the warm weather of ovember. some fielas are being felds are being pastured by laken as a whole, the crop serp aken asa whole, the crop is ser:ous damaged, with little prospect for The total number

The total anount of wheat shipped by railroads from the yarious stations us reported for October, is 171,914 bushels.

little is being fattened on account of little is being fattened on accquit of
the high price of hay. The coudition of horses, catle and sheep in the' state is 96 and of swine 97.
In most parts of the state fall pasfyre has been gowl. While it has been ton dry in some paris of the state for past ures to grow, the conditions fur the state being 87 , yet in themain all kinds of stock have done fairly well.

## Location of American Troods

The Americain army now in the Philippines, according to the repor of the War Secretnry, consists of 31.473 regulars and 15,982 , volunteers, aaking an ugyrequte of 47,465 , which will, when the troops enl route arrive be swolleu to a total. officers andmet of 63,483 , ill which will be lucluded all the volunteer regments. The rmy now in Cuba consiats of 11,18 officeers and men, all regulars, though cight companies of infantry and eight roops of cavaliy have receanly been de force constutn. In Purto Ric he force constst of 2,942 regulars of whom oue battahion is made up of
native Portu Ricans. In Hawaii the mericau forces consist of 565 regu iars, men and ufficers. In the United States and continental territories and differeut forces total 18,227 regulars making anl uggregate, all told, officers and men, of 64,247 regulars and 34,574 volunteers, or a grand wital uf 98,921 , of who 3,772 are commissioned officers and privates, or an
average of oue conmissioned officer to each 25.2 anlisted men.

New Dog Warden Law.
The attorney-general's office is kept busy these days answering inquiries in regard to the new dog warden law passed by the last legislature. The aw does nut go into operation until next May, but in a large number of localities, owing to a misunderstand the atatue consruing he provisions of the statute, dog wardens have been lecting the tax on dogs just the sume as though a cux on the animals had not been levied this year by the supervisors. In some instances yaluable dogs have been killed by the wardens upou the refusal of the owners to pay the tax, and while such killing of dogs would be legal after the first of next Ma; at present it amounts to destruction of property without authority of law. It is helieved that the uwners of dogs which have been dispatched by log wardens under a mistaken sense of duty may bring suit to recover the value of heir animals. The misunderstandngy regarding the provisions of the law originated from the fact that the aw reads that it shall go into effect May 1, 1899. As a matter of fact it was not passed by the legislaturs uneffect until Septamber 23. This being the case, and the assessiment of dogs for this year have already been nade by the supervisors under the old law, the attorney-general held hat the new law could not be made perative until next May.
A Visit to the Beet Sukar actories.
Five of the beet sugar factories now runnung in Michigan were visited a few days ago hy a party from the Uuiversity of Michigan headed by Perry F. Trowb:idge and Albert H . White, the instructors in the chesical department who have charge of the techical work of the beet sugar industry. Several of the advanced students in this line o tories at Rochester and Caro and the three at Bay City were visitod on this trip. The party was most cordially reveived in every case by the dially received in every case by the higher officers of the yurks, who affouded every opportunty and frank. ly apuswered all questious. Th heads of the companies all deplored the lack of trained American meu inevitable at the beginuing, and wer in sympathy with Michigan training for tho work. Owing to the coutinu ed dry weather last summer the yield of beets is not so large as the farmers expected. The analyses show tha the beets will average for the whol of the state between 13 and 14 per cellt of sugar, with a very high percentage of purity of the juice everal of the factories ars working over five hundred tous of beets darly yielding trom forty to sixty tons of pirre granulated sugar every twenty. four hours.
