Thus a soil rich in humes is rich in nitrogen and a soil poor in humes is ind a soil poor in humes is poor in nitrogen. Consequently it is the nitrogen of the humus and ingrediont. Because the roots of plants cluster around docayed vegetable matter in the soil they
are capable of feeding on humus, whereas it is the nitric acid which is being gradually formed and liberated from the moss that causes accumulations. Where the nitrogen exists in the soil there the roots of plants are cer tain to find their way. We need moro humus ordinatily than any other element known.
Besides the manufacture of plant food that goes on where aumus is in plentitul supply ni he soil, thero is another advant age in having plenty of humus dition of the soil It become prous and fiablo ind this the aid to readily penetrate th soll carrying with it atmospheric nitrogen which is converted into nitric acid and prepared for use by the plants. Humus also renders the soil capable of retain ing more moisture than it could makes the soil spungy and the
