Darling's drug store. | The Financial Conditions. <br> It is a singular fact that financial stringencies are'almost as apt to occur ${ }^{\prime}$ during perieds of unusual prosperity as in times of business depression. Two years ago the New York money market was depleted by extraordinary demands from the west. Big crops necessitated a large amount of money for moving them. Speculatiye investments had heavily on the bank reserves, and when the imperative demand came from the west there was a temptorarv shortage in New York which wrought some embarrassment. <br> Henry Clews points out the danger that this condition will recur in the near future unless unusual efforts are made to prepare easterı banks for a heavy demand. An unprecedented western crop is sure to create an usual demand for ready money, and reccent speculatiye movements haye absorbed a large amount of the floating cash. Loans are greatly expanded and bank reserves are low at the present time. The usual July disbursments are expected to replenish the reserves to some extent, but conditions abroad are such that the usual realizations from that quarter may not be forthcoming. There is a financial depression in several of the foreign money centers and this influence will presently be felt in: New York If the metropolitan banks do not exercise caution and hold out against other loanz, business men may presently be in the position of the man who was in danger of starvation because his sole possession was a million pound bank note. <br> With a wheat crop estimated at $700.000,000$ bushels the prosperity of the country is secure; but if the money for moving this crop is not available much embarrassment will follow. A safe full of gold is of no avail for immediate use if the owner has carelessly forgotten the combma-tion.-Evening News: |
