Beet Seed Preparation.

A very original mode of preparing beet seed before planting consists in submitting them to a thorough brushing and then to the action of steam during a short period, this being followed by a treatment with concentrated sulphuric acid or any other disinfectant. The brushing has for its main object the removal of any dust and of the portion most attacked by parasites. There are advantages in resorting to this treatment before the vaporization, as the dried seed may be more readily brushed than the moist; furthermore, the brushes do not become clogged with the impurities. The object of the vaporization is to render the mass of the seed in a condition that it will rapidly absorb the chemical agents used in the treatment.

A Disagreement.

The taking testimony in the Scholtz murder case was completed Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock, and the court adjourned until Monday morning, when the arguments were begun. Judge Conning finish his charge and gave the case to the jury at 4 o'clock that afternoon. No agreement was reached that night and when the court convened Tuesday morning the jury asked for a portion of the judge's charge to be given them again, and the entire charge was read them, when they returned to the jury room, and remained until 12:30 Tuesday night without an agreement. The judge then called them in and discharged them. We understand that the jury stood 10 for conviction and two for acquittal. The case will be tried again at the February term. Tuesday Clement Craft, charged with assault to do great bodily harm
