a check of all names is made. The school board receives a certain amount of money from the state each year for each name appearing on the rolls. The names must be of children between the ages of five and 20 ears only. Last year the state paid on the basis of \$10.50 per name. It is expected, however, that this year's allotment will be smaller. The amount is paid out of a public utilities tax fund and varies directly with the promptness in which the utilities pay

their amounts to the state. Last year saw many delinquent firms paying their back taxes and the amount was higher than in some years past. Ordinarily the amount averages \$7.

OLD TIME SALE 75 YEARS AGO The following clipping from the Anderson (Ky.) News of 1849 was handed to us the other day. One item in the sale was that of thirtytwo gallons of seven year old whisky. Large copper still and slaves also included:

"Having sold my farm and am leaving for 'Oregon Territory' by ox team, will offer on March 1, 1849, all of my personal property, to-wit:

"All ox teams except two teams, Buck and Ben and Tom and Jerry; 2 milk cows; 1 gray mare and colt; 1 pair of oxen and yoke; 1 baby yoke; 2 ox carts; 1 iron plow with wood mole board; 800 ft. of poplar weather boards; 1,000 three-foot clap boards; 1,500 ten-foot fence rails; 1 sixtygallon soap kettle; 85 sugar troughs made of white ash timber; 10 gallons of maple syrup; 2 spinning whee's; 30 pounds of mutton tallow; 1 large loom made by Jerry Wilson; 300 poles; 100 split hoops; 100 empty barrels; 1- 32 gallon barrel of Johnson-Miller whiskey 7 years old; 20 ga'lons of apple brandy; one 40-gallon copper still; oak tanned leather; 1 dozen real books; 2 handle hooksr 3 scythes and cradles; 1 dozen wooden pitchforks; one-half interest in tan yard; one 32-calibre rifle; bullet mold and powder horn; rifle made by Ben Miller; 50 gal'ons soft soap; hams, bacon and lard; 40 gallons of sorghum molasses; six head of fox hounds, all softmouthed except one. "At the same time I will sel! my six negro slaves-two men 35 and 50 years old, two boys, mulatto wenches 40 and 30 years old. Will sell all together to same party as will not separate them. "Terms of sale, cash in hand, or note to draw 4 per cent interest with Bob McConnell as security. "My home is two miles south of Versailles, Kentucky, on McConns ferry pike. Sale begins at 8.00 a. m. Plenty to eat and drink. J. L. Moss."
