



who in investigating the madstones in use in Pennsylvania in 1889, found that they were smooth pebbles evidently selected on account of some peculiarity of shape or marking, and the most famous of them all was a piece of white feldspar entirely lacking in the powers of absorption attributed to

The serpent-stone, which all over the world is supposed to be a cure for the bite of a venomous serpent, is but a duplicate of the madstone. Pliny calls the snake-stone the "serpent's egg" and the ancient belief was that the stone was either an egg of the serpent or-as was more generally believed-was extracted from the serpent's head and cured by sympathetic magic. The "Druid's giass" is the name for them among the Welsh and Irish, large contection of madand in stones and serpent stones in the Museum of Scotch Antiquaries many are actually pieces of ancient glass, or. like the highly prized Pennsylvania madstone, polished feldspar. The madstone superstition, it will be seen, has a pedigree going back to primitive man and is based on sympa thetic magic. The first madstone was undoubtedly a bezoar-that calcareous deposit sometimes found in an animal -as the serpent-stone was supposed to be a bezoar taken from a serpent. Gradually these magic stones became any pebbles or pieces of glass selected by the Druid priests-or by the super stitious inhabitants of Pennsylvania. (C by McClure Newspaper Syndicate.)
